# Safeguarding news

The children had a very interesting assembly from the NSPCC who brought in their mascot.

Due to increased Government legislation and School Inspection, School now has to record and report holidays taken by pupils during term time as unauthorised absence, in accordance with Bexley Council guidelines, to our newly appointed Education Welfare Officer.

We are delighted that we have been assigned by Bexley Council a Health Visitor (0-5 year olds) which will also give us access to Bexley services for 5-11 year olds.

## Parking
