"Then a boy fell from the sky. But he wasn't a boy. He was a robot, he came from another dimension. His name was HILO."



One of our favourite tales, *The Purple Lady*, follows Abu who must rescue his missing sister. These wonderful fables are lovely to read solo or out loud.

This moving and heart-wrenching story is the next must-have book in Cathy Cassidy's brilliant *Lost and Found* series.
