► SCIENCE TERM

Last term was Science Term with a focus on 'Sustainability & Growth'.

Why is it important to look after the earth? There is only one earth - there is no Planet B. The decisions we make every day can impact people in every part of the world. By reducing our impact on the planet we can help make the planet a little bit better for other people. There are many ways we can become more eco in school. During assemblies last term, each year group explored the various aspects of sustainability and reflected on the different ways we could contribute to help our planet. We addressed issues relating to wildlife, energy, transport, recycling, food, water and energy. The hall displays show the detailed, scientific work each year group carried out during their investigations. With the motto of 'Think Globally - Act Locally' in mind, we planned a wide range of activities for the term. Each class planted vegetables, fruit and flowers in the allotment. The seniors took part in a creative and inspiring workshop called 'OUR WORLD - OUR FUTURE', which was a Climate Change workshop delivered by a company called 'West-Endin-Schools'. They investigated one of the most important issues in the world today from an interactive, drama-based perspective. We held a poster competition on 'Growth', in line with British Science Week, and displayed more than two hundred entries in our hall. It was a creative way to reflect on the different interpretations of growth. Our school also organised a Sponsored Litter Pick – fundraising for Ukraine. The children did some litter picking in their own neighbourhood whilst raising money for a good cause. The £3,300 raised went towards our chosen charity, Dnepr Children's City Hospital No. 3 in Ukraine. We held 'House Science' and 'Spelling Bee' competitions in year groups and the winners collected their awards at prize giving.
