
Improvements in School Spring 2023

S2 (Year 4) Hilltop Residential Trip

Friday 5 May – Saturday 6 May

We had already booked our date for Hilltop when King Charles III decided to choose that date for his Coronation. We went to Hilltop anyway, for a two-day residential which was fantastic! We were so lucky with the excellent weather on the North Norfolk Coast, challenging ourselves to try physically demanding activities, using trust and teamwork to great effect. The 'Super Swing' was the firm favourite!

Science Week

Monday 22 May – Friday 26 May

This year, Science is paired up with Technology (ICT and DT) to be able to fully embrace the theme of 'Connections'. Nearly all innovations in science, technology, engineering and maths are built on connections between people after all. This topic will







allow us to discover the different ways connections appear across all areas of science. For example:

- Evolution how animals, plants, bacteria are all connected;
- How atoms connect to form chemical bonds;
- Exploring science and technology behind the internet; space exploration/inventions in trying to connect to the outside world;
- The connection between human actions and climate change;
- The human body: how our organs are connected and work together;
- Connections between plants, animals and humans;
- Materials: connection between the type of material and its uses:
- Animal Habitats: wild areas (e.g. long grass, logs) attract insects that attract other animals that eat insects and so on... Or explore the connection between human actions and their impact on animal habitats (positive and negative).

In **ICT**, each yeargroup will have a different focus this term to investigate connections:

- 13: Science animation
- S1: Programme a Mars explorer
- S2: Programme a virtual pet
- S3: Newton and gravity cloning apples
- S4: Virtual-reality pets

Science term started with a **Science Workshop** called 'Silly Science' on Thursday, 27 April 2023 for all children in J2-S4.

To link with **Design and Technology**, we have organised a 'Techno-day' during Science Week (24 May) for the children to enter a competition with their own design of a 'Perfect Pet' - more details on that to follow. On 15 June, J1-J3 will also take part in a STEM – CONNECTONS – LEGO workshop. This workshop encourages young people to think about everyday technology and engineering challenges and get hands-on to solve them. An experienced facilitator will work with a class at a time to solve tricky challenges, using maths and engineering to model real-life solutions.
