S3 French Trip to the Battlefields of France and Belgium – Thurs 14-16 September



S3 (Yr 5) had a great educational residential trip to Chateau d'Eblinghem. High points were certainly the privilege of laying a wreath at the incredibly moving Menin Gate evening service. We also laid wreaths at the graves of past pupils and went in search particularly of a past pupil's elder brother who died at Neuve-Chapelle, and an S3's great uncle. We also visited the Canadian memorial at Vimy and Wellington Quarry in Arras.

This was a great experience for the children of S3 who will be leading our annual Remembrance Service in November.

We received a lovely letter from a lady who was visiting Menin Gate on the same evening we did, she wrote "I just thought I would drop you a line to say how impressed I and my two friends were by the conduct of all your students on 14 September 2023 at the Menin Gate ceremony. They were all beautifully behaved and clearly very aware of the importance of the ceremony. In particular, the children who acted as flag bearers and who laid the wreath were very impressive. I can imagine they might have easily become overwhelmed by the event, but they all carried out their respective tasks perfectly".


