#### ► SCIENCE WEEK – 'A BRIEF HISTORY OF TIME'

The topic for British Science Week this year is 'Time' as it is key to so many discoveries in science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM). This particular focus provided an excellent opportunity for us to create a link between science and history. Taking their history topic, each year group looked at scientific advances and discoveries. S1 and S2 investigated forensic archaeology and the science behind that. Different year groups explored and





learnt about dinosaurs and castles, inventions and medicine through history along with how the Romans, Vikings, Victorians and the Islamic World have contributed to science.

Year groups also organised either a school trip or a workshop to further engage in their chosen topic. These trips and workshops brought an excellent opportunity to enhance learning and to provide our young learners with unforgettable first-hand experiences.

Each year group prepared an assembly and a coffee morning to share their findings, with our hall displays reflecting all the learning and discoveries made in preparation for year group assemblies.

Science Week took place the week beginning 29th January, traditionally starting with the House Science Quiz for the Seniors. Later in the week, our Spelling Bee Competition was held with a science focus. We had a guest speaker talk to the children about Forensic Archaeology. S1 and S2 were then invited to join her to investigate some archaeological finds and unravel more mysteries of the past. The final event of the week saw us all dressed up as a famous scientist or a historian, whilst raising money for our chosen charity, 'Ickle Pickles'.

#### ► S4 STRICTLY SPECTACULAR


